Findings from the survey

The overall outcome 90% of students satisfied with coverage of syllabus more than 85%.

The students appreciated the preparation of teachers with remark "Thoroughly".

The evaluation process is transparency in the institution and 83% of students strongly agree it.

The academic activities in teaching has been appreciated by the students which includes preparation of faculty in subjects, giving real examples, mentoring and motivation of students, use ICT resources, subject expertise, regularity in work.

The academic activities majorly include workshops, department seminars, conferences, guest lectures. The institution further supports to career counselling, placement drive, skill development and industrial visits as extension activities 85% agree with it.

The students also take part in other activities like expo, cultural, sports through women empowerment cell. We also make the students to take part in social responsibilities like blood donation camp, tree plantation, village cleaning and awareness programmes. In overall 93% of students strongly agree with the statement that the quality of teaching learning process in the institution is very good.

The SSS has also pointed out few grey areas where the college/ teachers/ departments do have scope for enhancement in quality of education.

- Conduct more college assessment which will identify strength and weakness of students and provide them support and help them to overcome their weakness.
- Teachers need to promote course competencies and programme outcomes

- Mentors need to follow the mechanism which will identify strength and weakness
 of students and provide them right level of challenges and help them to overcome
 their weakness.
- More effort should me made to monitor and improve teaching learning process
- There should be more use of ICT in teaching.
